PLAYER AND PARENTAL/GUARDIAN CONSENT

Please note that this part of the form needs to be signed by the Young Player (if aged between 12 and 18) as well as by the Parent or Legal Guardian of the Young Player.

1. Consent for First Aid or Emergency Treatment- Taplow Cricket Club request parental consent for the administration of basic first aid to young cricketers where necessary by qualified first aiders. Parents/guardians should ensure both the coach and team manager are aware of any known medical conditions or medications of each young cricketer – those who suffer with conditions such as Asthma should bring their inhalers (clearly labelled) to each practice session. In the event of an emergency, the above contact details will be used, please therefore ensure all contact details are kept up to date. (Copies of accident forms will be held in the Club records).

2. Permission for the use of photographs and recorded images - TCC do not permit photographs, video images or other images of Young People to be taken or used without the consent of the Parent/Guardian and the Young Player. Photographs or recorded images taken are used solely for the purpose they are intended, which is the promotion and celebration of cricketing activities. If photographs e.g. team or action shots, are submitted to the Press or published on our website or in our handbook individuals will not ordinarily be identified. Where a child or young person is identified it will only be with the explicit consent of parents.Please indicate in writing if you do not wish the Club to photograph or video your involvement in cricket under the above terms and conditions, or if you do not consent to your name and/or Club being published with any photograph in authorised Club/Event publications or Press articles.Whilst TCC will do all that it can to ensure the safety of children during photographed events, it is the responsibility of the parent concerned to ensure that if their child is not to be photographed and partakes in an activity and is by the nature of the activity inadvertently photographed or filmed, TCC cannot be held responsible.

3. Transport to matches and practice sessions - TCC policy is that parents or other responsible adults are responsible for transporting players to and from all matches and practice sessions and therefore the Club will not be registering Private Vehicles for the transportation of individuals in connection with any fixtures or practice sessions arranged by the Club. The implementation of this policy is not intended to exclude any player from participation and parents or guardians should contact the Club Welfare Officer if they have any problems with the transportation of players to matches or practice sessions.

4 Changing Arrangements- All young cricketers under the age of 16 will be asked to change and shower at home; however, if young players are playing in adult matches and wish to share the changing facilities with adults, parents have the option to supervise them whilst they are changing. The club will make reasonable efforts to arrange this.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR JUNIOR MEMBERS

TCC is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the wellbeing of all its members and believes that it is important that members, coaches, administrators and parents associated with the club should, at all times, show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Therefore, members are encouraged to be open at all times and to share any concerns or complaints that they may have about any aspect of the club with our Club Welfare Officer.

As a member of TCC you are expected to abide by the following junior code of conduct:

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions.
- All members must respect the rights, dignity and worth of all participants regardless of gender, ability, cultural background or religion.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for training and competitions or inform their coach or team manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must pay all fees and complete registration promptly.
- Junior members are not allowed to smoke, consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.
